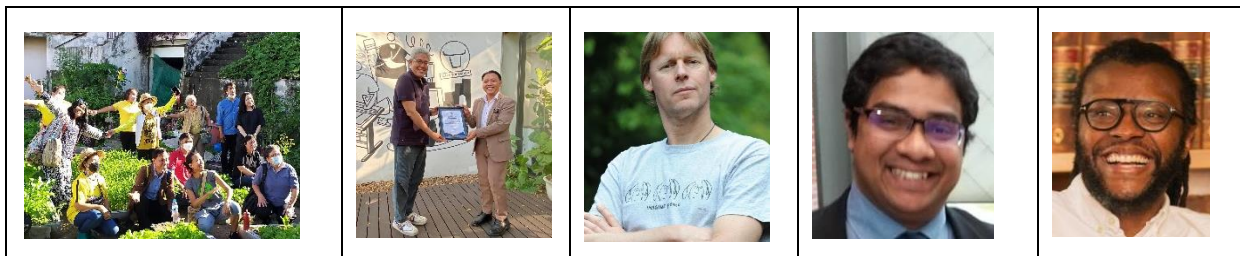

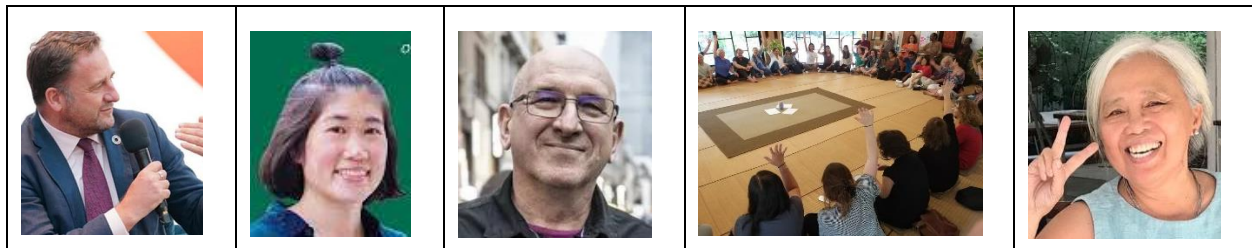

Shaping the role of Thailand and ASEAN on **Earth System Governance**, in light of ASEAN's emerging **Post-2025 Vision**. Voices of **civil society, Youth, experts in environmental law, independent academia, and responsible business.**


Rationale

In September 2024 the **Summit of the Future** will be held in New York, following suggestions of the UN Secretary-General in his groundbreaking *Our Common Agenda*. Multiple initiatives are shaping up towards recommended “open coalition networking” with the purpose to strengthen **Earth System Governance** and aregenerative economy. See the Report of the UN HLAB on Effective Multilateralism <https://www.highleveladvisoryboard.org/breakthrough/> titled **A Breakthrough for People and Planet**. A network of Right Livelihood Laureates and the World Future Council recommends “*Enhance the concepts of Rights of Nature and Earth Trusteeship in our relationship with*

the earth and in our political and legal systems.” In this line the **Earth Trusteeship Working Group** (ETWG) was set up three years ago, initiated by Right Livelihood College Bangkok. At the grassroots level RLC Bangkok and partners enabled the start of the **Connecting the Commons** (CTC) project with support of the Heinrich Böll Foundation Southeast Asia.

The purpose of the conference is to explore innovative concepts toward Earth System Governance as well as how initiatives rooted in **ASEAN and its Post-2025 Vision, Southeast Asia, Asia Pacific** can feed into this **global “open coalition networking”**. Suggestions have been made that the Summit of the Future should not be limited to New York, but see satellite activities budding all over the world.

Bangkok is cherished as the cradle of ASEAN as well as the core UN platform for Asia Pacific. From this perspective, it is felt as an important challenge to shape ASEAN and Asia Pacific contributions to “open coalition networking” toward the Summit of the Future. With creative input from *academia-civil society* collaboration, **Youth initiatives** and a growing **commons movement** in the region.
